## THE GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL (GARNETHILL AREA) (TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT AND PARKING CONTROLS) ORDER

As a local resident/business, I write to advise you that we are commencing the process to amend existing the parking controls for the Garnethill area.

Prior to the statutory process we are holding a public exhibition in the Garnethill Multicultural Centre, 21 Rose Street G3 6RE on Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2018 between 2pm and 8pm and Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> March 2018 between 12pm and 4pm. Council officers will be in attendance to explain how the scheme could work and to answer any questions or concerns you may have.

Currently visitors to the area experience difficulty in purchasing the vouchers, there are now fewer places selling them than when they were first introduced. Therefore we are proposing a different payment method for visitors to pay for their parking. This would be our mobile phone payment system which operates throughout Glasgow. Using this system people can pay for parking by using an App or by phoning up. Details are available at <u>www.myringgo.co.uk</u> This has become a popular way for people to pay for their parking, rather than using a pay and display machine. Utilising this will also mean we do not have to install pay and display machines throughout the area.

The other elements of the proposal are: -

- Residents parking permits at £50 per annum. This will bring the resident parking permit price into line with other schemes throughout the city.
- Business parking permits at £700 per annum, this has been requested by a local business.
- To make the lanes Restricted Parking Zones which means we can enforce a no waiting at any time restriction without the need for yellow lines.
- Changes to the one-ways if required.
- Minor changes to parking layouts, including additional parking bays where

appropriate. However, it may be difficult to provide any more parking.

- 2 hour maximum stay for pay to park using RingGo.
- New parking tariff at 60p for 12 minutes. This is the same as the city centre, if it was cheaper than the city centre it would encourage more people to park in this residential area.
- Request for a disabled parking bay adjacent to 103 Hill Street.

There are currently no proposals to change the following:-

- The resident visitor vouchers will remain as they are.
- Charges will still apply Monday to Sunday 8am to 10pm.
- Loading restriction "No loading Monday to Saturday 8am to 6pm except for goods vehicles" will remain.
