

Calton Barras (20mph speed limit zone) order 201_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

Background to the proposed Order

Glasgow City Council are currently in the process of implementing Mandatory 20mph Speed Limit Zones throughout the City.

The purpose of the Mandatory 20mph Speed Limit Zone is to ensure that vehicle users reduce their speeds to 20mph or less, and therefore improve road safety for pedestrians, cyclists and all other vehicle users. By turn, it is anticipated that this will encourage more people to walk and cycle, which would have associated health benefits.

The roads affected by these proposals are bounded by:

Binnie Place, Monteith Row, Bain Street, McFarlane Street, Bell Street and Hunter Street.

Bain Street, Bell Street, Binnie Place, Charlotte Street, East Campbell Street, Gallowgate, Gibson Street, Great Dovehill, Greendyke Street, Hunter Street, Kent Street, Lanark Street, Little Dovehill, London Road, London Way, McFarlane Street, Moir Street, Molendinar Street, Moncur Street, Montieth Place, Montieth Row, Ross Street, Saracen Head Road, Spoutmouth, Stevenson Street, St Andrews Lane, Suffolk Street.

This proposal would introduce a mandatory 20mph speed limit zone.
