**THE GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL, Connecting Woodside**

Thank you for your e-mail of 19 June extending an invitation to the consultation event on 26 June and the opportunity to comment on the proposals for Connecting Woodside.

Many of our members attended the event at Woodside Library and others have added comments to the on-line consultation.

We are very pleased that Glasgow City Council has obtained funding for the Connecting Woodside active travel works and are generally in favour of the proposals that were shown at the consultation event and are displayed on-line; they are a big improvement on the existing infrastructure. We do have some preferences – for Section B on Garscube Road the fully segregated junction is our choice, for North Woodside Road we like the layout shown on your photograph where the 2 cycle lanes are separated from each other and from the pedestrian areas by planted zones. We are, though, concerned about the approaches to the crossing of Maryhill Road which you do not show as a straight line. It is most likely that people will cycle in a direct line rather than the route you show in the paving and we suggest that you design for this.

As work progresses on the design, we look forward to being involved in further discussions with you and in your consultations.
