## **NOTICE OF PROPOSALS**

## **City Centre**

(traffic management) order 2010 (variation no.24) (bus priority) order 201\_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The order proposes to provide bus priority measures on the main public transport corridors in the City Centre in line with published Scottish Government and Glasgow City Council policies to reduce emissions and encourage sustainable transport.

The roads affected by these proposals are bounded by: Broomielaw, Oswald Street/Hope Street, Robertson Street, St Vincent Street and West Nile Street.

The list of roads affected by these proposals are:

Oswald Street, Union Street and West Nile Street.

Details of the proposals are as follows:

- Proposed Restriction to all vehicles except Buses, Taxis, Licensed Private Hire Cars, Cycles and Goods Vehicles every day between 7am and 7pm on Oswald Street between Midland Street and Argyle Street.
- Proposed Restriction to all vehicles except Buses, Licensed Private Hire Cars, Authorised Vehicles, Cycles and Goods Vehicles every day between 7am and 7pm on Union Street between Gordon Street and Argyle Street.
- Removal of disabled vehicle parking spaces on Union Street at Central station.
- Removal of disabled vehicle parking space on Oswald Street at Argyle Street.
- Provide additional disabled vehicle parking spaces on West Nile Street south of St Vincent Street to replace Union Street spaces.
- Amendment to parking and loading on east side of Oswald Street between Midland Street and Argyle Street.
