

**THE GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL  
(WOODSIDE HEALTH CENTRE)  
(TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 201\_**

Glasgow City Council propose to consider the introduction of a Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The area affected by this proposal is generally bounded by:-

Maryhill Road, Garscube Road and Hinshaw Road.

The roads affected by these proposals are:-

Doncaster Street, Hinshaw Street, Hinshaw Street (Access Road), Maltbarns Street, Unnamed Road (Accessing rear of properties 430-480 Maryhill Road)

Details of the proposals are as follows:-

Glasgow City Council recognise that obstructive parking within the area is restricting pedestrians and vehicle movements at all junctions and believe these proposals will address this issue and also improve road safety and pedestrian safety in the area.

The main features of the proposals are:-

- No Waiting at any time.
- Mandatory Disabled parking bays
- Ambulance parking place
- Buses parking place
