Robroyston Station (Traffic Regulation) Order 201

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The order proposes to provide protection for the access roads and local residential roads in the vicinity of the new Robroyston Station.

The roads affected by these proposals are bounded by:

Station Road and the M80 motorway.

The list of roads affected by these proposals are:

Bogside Road, Dunalistair Drive, Ingleneuk Avenue, Millersneuk Crescent, New Station Road, Saughs Avenue, Station Road.

Details of the proposals are as follows:

- No waiting at any time no loading or unloading at any time on Saughs Avenue under the M80 motorway.
- No waiting at any time no loading or unloading at any time on the full extent of New City Road (new construction).
- No waiting at any time no loading or unloading at any time on the full extent of Bogside Road (new construction).
- No waiting at any time no loading or unloading at any time on both sides of Station Road from Millersneuk Crescent to the junction of Bogside Road (new construction).
- No waiting at any time no loading or unloading at any time at Millersneuk Crescent junctions to protect access.
