NOTICE OF PROPOSALS

School Streets, Glasgow (Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 202_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

The Experimental Traffic Regulation Order which covers Phase 1 of the School Car Free Zone pilot scheme expires in 2021, and, due to the success of the pilot scheme, the Council proposes to make this permanent Order.

This Traffic Regulation Order will improve road safety on the undernoted roads by reducing congestion and minimising the number of vehicles permitted to travel on these roads at the beginning and end of the school day.

The Order will apply to all vehicles other than emergency services vehicles, residents which have been issued permits, essential care providers and contract taxis engaged to transport pupils requiring additional support for learning. Pedal cyclists and holders of a disabled persons blue badge will also be exempt.

THE LIST OF ROADS AFFECTED BY THESE PROPOSALS ARE:

- 1. Bankhead Primary Caldwell Avenue and Broadlie Drive
- 2. Broomhill Primary Elmwood Avenue, Elmwood Lane
- Hillhead Primary Westbank Quadrant, Otago Street (south of Gibson Street)
- 4. St Blane's Primary Arrochar Drive
- 5. Our Lady of the Rosary Lourdes Avenue, Tarfside Gardens
- 6. Lourdes Primary school access road.

DETAILS OF THE PROPOSALS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

The proposed Order will comprise of:

 Prohibiting of driving on the above roads between the hours of 8:30am and 9:15am, and between 2:30pm and 3:15pm, Monday to Friday except for permitted vehicles.
