

Brockburn Road (Traffic Regulation) Order 202_

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

The purpose of this Order is to enable the provision of on carriageway cycle facilities linking to Corkerhill Road which connects to Pollok Country Park. Therefore enabling safer and more sustainable travel options within the local area and connecting to the wider cycle network.

THE ROADS AFFECTED BY THESE PROPOSALS ARE BOUNDED BY

The order will affect the residential area generally bounded by Crookston Road to the north west, and Peat Road to the south.

THE LIST OF ROADS AFFECTED BY THESE PROPOSALS ARE

Brockburn Road.

NO WAITING AT ANY TIME, NO LOADING OR UNLOADING AT ANY TIME

- **On the Western Kerbline (northbound carriageway):** from a point 40 metres south of the extended south kerbline of Brockburn Terrace, in a northern direction to a point 5 metres east of the extended eastern kerbline of Linthaugh Road.
- **On the Eastern Kerbline (southbound carriageway):** from a point 15 metres south of the extended south kerbline of Brockburn Terrace, in a northern direction to a point 145 metres north west of the extended western kerbline of Glenside Avenue.
- **On the Eastern Kerbline (southbound carriageway):** from a point 223 metres northwest of the extended west kerbline of Glenside Avenue, in a northern direction to a point 10 metres east of the extended eastern kerbline of Linthaugh Road.

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- **On the Western Kerbline (northbound carriageway):** from a point 40 metres south of the extended south kerbline of Brockburn Terrace, in a northern direction to a point 5 metres east of the extended eastern kerbline of Linthaugh Road.
