NOTICE OF PROPOSALS

Haggs Road (Traffic Management) Order 20__

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

DETAILS OF THE PROPOSED ORDER

The proposal is to amend the existing traffic restrictions to reflect the changes planned to the Pollok Park exit junction on Haggs Road and to improve junction flow. As part of the Burrell Collection and Pollok Park improvements, the exit road on to Haggs Road will now serve as both an entrance and exit.

The main features of the proposals are:

- No through road from Shawmoss Road into Pollok Park
- No right turn from Haggs Road (southbound) into Pollok Park
- No waiting at any time, no loading or unloading at any time on sections of Haggs Road, Shawmoss Road and Herries Road in the vicinity of the Pollok Park entrance.

Due to the prohibition of the right turn in to Pollok Park from Haggs Road, vehicles travelling southbound that wish to access Pollok Park will be required to route via the Pollokshaws Road roundabout.

AREA AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED ORDER

The roads affected by these proposals are bounded by: Titwood Road to the north, Shawmoss Road to the east, Pollokshaws Road to the south and the Pollok Park to the west.

The list of roads affected by these proposals are:

Haggs Road, Herries Road, Pollok Park entrance/exit road and Shawmoss Road.

THE GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL (HAGGS ROAD) (TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT) ORDER 20

Report

Background to the proposed Order

The proposal is to amend the existing traffic restrictions to reflect the changes planned to the Pollok Park exit junction on Haggs Road. As part of the Burrell Collection and Pollok Park improvements, the exit road on to Haggs Road will now serve as both the entrance and exit. To improve junction flow, the following restrictions will be in place:

- No through road from Shawmoss Road into Pollok Park
- No right turn from Haggs Road (southbound) into Pollok Park
- No waiting at any time, no loading or unloading at any time on sections of Haggs Road, Shawmoss Road and Herries Road in the vicinity of the Pollok Park entrance.

Due to the prohibition of the right turn in to Pollok Park from Haggs Road, vehicles travelling southbound that wish to access Pollok Park will be required to route via the Pollokshaws Road roundabout.

Area affected by the proposed Order

The roads affected by these proposals are bounded by:

Titwood Road to the north, Shawmoss Road to the east, Pollokshaws Road to the south and the Pollok Park to the west.

The list of roads affected by these proposals are:

Haggs Road, Herries Road, Pollok Park entrance/exit road and Shawmoss Road.

Details of the proposed Order

The proposed restrictions (as depicted on the TRO plan) will comprise of:

- No Waiting, No Loading or Unloading at any time
- Prohibition of Entry
- Prohibition of Right Turn

The elements of the proposal are detailed below

No waiting at any time, no loading or unloading at any time

This restriction will be proposed at locations where waiting and loading is deemed unsafe in terms of road safety or pedestrian safety or could negatively affect traffic flow or turning manoeuvres.

Prohibition of Entry

This restriction will remain in place on Shawmoss Road due to the constraints of the building and road geometry. The access in to the park will be encouraged to route via the Pollokshaws Road roundabout and approach the entrance from the south of Haggs Road and turn left.

Prohibition of Right Turn

The existing junction currently operates close to (or over) capacity at peak times during the week. By prohibiting the right turn on Haggs Road and not having this movement within the signal staging, the operation of the junction will improve.
